Happy Summer!

We had a tough Budget Deliberation this past spring as there has been uncertainty and real cuts to the county at the state and federal levels. We have to pass a balanced budget, live within our means and cannot run a deficit. That is tougher as costs are up everywhere. Contrary to popular belief, Baltimore County pays the same higher energy bills for county facilities, street lights, and schools that you endure in your households.

Another issue—back in 2009, the State of Maryland cut the gas tax money that it had previously shared with counties. Thus, Baltimore County lost about \$40 million in revenue that was used to pave county roads and maintain county bridges. When that money was cut, Baltimore County had to take money from other programs to pave our roads. **We currently spend about \$16 million a year on road resurfacing when we need to spend about 2 to 3 times that amount.** While I'm a fan of low taxes, we also need to find revenue sources to make sure our roads get the attention they need.

We are drafting a few different pieces of legislation including:

- A potential Ballot issue (referendum) on the way the county handles future Inspector General appointments.
- A bill that will create a Pilot Program to limit the percentage of rental properties in a neighborhood to 1/3 or less.


I'm also working with:

- The Planning Department and the Chesapeake Gateway of Commerce on some beautification and store front initiatives along Belair Road and Harford Road.
- A group of volunteers to resurrect a Parkville / Overlea Area Business Association and the Hillendale Neighborhood Association.

The Redistricting Commission

The 2025 Redistricting Commission submitted the proposed map on June 9th to the County Council and the final report on June 17th.

The Council held a Public Input Meeting on July 8th to receive feedback on the expansion of the County Council from 7 to 9

Districts and the Redistricting Commission's recommendations. We spent a lot of time listening to county residents and what they wish for the final district maps to look like.

The Council is required to submit the final redistricting bill and map by October 1st.


Baltimore County Rec & Parks held a Public Input meeting on June 11th, 2025 for proposed additions at West Towson Park.

The Department of Planning is currently looking for feedback for Small Area Plan 11 (SAP11) for the Bowleys Quarters, Essex, Middle River, Rossville and White Marsh.

The Small Area Plans are intended to provide areaspecific recommendations for achieving and refining the goals of the Master Plan by sectioning the County map into 12 areas, blended by neighborhood similarities.

Each SAP will engage citizens, stakeholders and county agencies to gather input on various aspects, including land use, zoning, pedestrian and road improvements and community design.


