- FOR the purpose of amending the Voluntary Security Camera Registration Program; providing for the Police Department to maintain the registry; providing for the application of the program; authorizing the adoption of certain regulations; and generally relating to a Voluntary Security Camera Registration Program.
- BY repealing and re-enacting, with amendments

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE

22	VOLUNTARILY register ONE OR MORE OF their private security [or surveillance camera]

6	To [promote and] ensure the [continued accuracy of the camera location,] REGISTRY
7	REMAINS ACCURATE, registration shall [automatically] expire after two years, after which
8	the property owner may renew the registration [in the same manner as set forth in § 13-11-302].
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10	§ 13-11-305. Adoption of Regulations.
11	The Director of the Office of [Budget and Finance, in consultation with the Director of
12	the Office of] Information Technology and the Chief of Police, may adopt regulations in
13	accordance with Article 3, Title 7 of the Code in order to carry out the purposes of this subtitle.
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15	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act shall take effect 45 days
16	from the date of its enactment.
