Zoning Regulations - Commercial Film Production

- FOR the purpose of requiring a use permit for commercial film production in a residential zone, regardless of the number of days a lot is used; requiring certain notice to be posted; and generally relating to use permits for commercial film production.
- BY repealing and re-enacting, with amendments

Section 435 Baltimore County Zoning Regulations, as amended

1	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
2	COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations read as follows:

1	ARTICLE 4 – SPECIAL REGULATIONS
2	Section 435 – Commercial Film Production
3	
4	§ 435.1. Permit required.
5	A use permit, pursuant to the provisions of SECTION 500.4 OF THESE
6	REGULATIONS, shall be required if the same record lot is used, by the same or different
7	producers for more than three days in a 12-month period, except as provided in Section 435.2.
8	
9	§ 435.2. Exception to permit requirements.
10	A. In any nonresidential zone, a use permit shall not be required, provided that the
11	production is confined entirely to private property; involves no more than two vehicles, each
12	with a gross vehicle weight less than 10,000 pounds; and involves a crew of no more than a total
13	of ten persons.
14	B. IN ANY RESIDENTIAL ZONE, A USE PERMIT SHALL BE REQUIRED,
15	REGARDLESS OF THE NUMBER OF DAYS THE RECORD LOT IS USED AND NOTICE
16	SHALL BE POSTED IN A TIME AND MANNER THAT GIVES REASONABLE NOTICE
17	TO ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNERS, AS DETERMINED BY THE DIRECTOR OF
18	PERMITS, APPROVALS, AND INSPECTIONS, OR THEIR DESIGNEE.

20	§ 435.3. Fees for county services.
21	The Administrative Officer, pursuant to § 3-1-202 of the Baltimore County Code, is
22	authorized to establish fees to offset the costs of county services, including but not limited to

1	police, security, traffic, and other services, as may be required by the commercial film
2	production.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having been passed by
 the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect 14 days after its
 enactment.
