A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

The 2025-2026 Current Expense Budget Gifts and Grants Special Revenue Fund Maryland Opioid Restitution Funding FY2026

FOR the purpose of amending the 2025-2026 Current Expense Budget, by appropriating to the Gifts and Grants Special Revenue Fund monies derived from state funds and made available to the County through the Maryland's Office of Overdose Response.

WHEREAS, the Maryland's Office of Overdose Response has made an award of state funds available to the Baltimore County Fire Department, to be used to allow the QRT the opportunity to expand these overdose resources to the community from two days per week to five. The Quick Response Team will refer individuals to treatment and provide access to community resources for both individuals with SUD and their families. Individuals who are not ready to seek treatment will receive scheduled follow-up to ensure engagement; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Sections 306 and 712(a) of the Baltimore County
Charter and Section 10-6-102 of the Baltimore County Code, 2015, as amended, the County
Council may accept gifts and grants, appropriate same to the Gifts and Grants Special Revenue
Fund and expend the same, said fund having been established solely for the purpose of
accounting for certain monetary gifts and grants made available to the County for restricted
purposes; and

WHEREAS, such fund remains open perpetually as a mechanism to account for the respective gift and grant appropriations and expenditures throughout the entire term of the grant period, including beyond the current expense budget fiscal year; now therefore

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE

COUNTY, MARYLAND, pursuant to the power and authority conferred upon it by Sections 306 and 712(a) of the Baltimore County Charter and Section 10-6-102 of the Baltimore County

Code, 2015, as amended, that the Current Expense Budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, be and is hereby amended by appropriating state funds made available to the Baltimore

County Fire Department in the amount herein specified, to the following program:

GR-2145 MD Opioid Restitution Funding FY2026 \$38,315

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having been passed by

the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect October 19, 2025.
