AN ACT concerning

The 2025-2026 Current Expense Budget Gifts and Grants Special Revenue Fund Long-Term & Dementia Care Program

FOR the purpose of amending the 2025-2026 Current Expense Budget, by appropriating to the Gifts and Grants Special Revenue Fund monies derived from state funds and made available to the County through the Maryland Department of Aging.

WHEREAS, the Maryland Department of Aging has made an award of state funds available to the Baltimore County Department of Aging, to be used to provide navigation services that enhance the ability of persons with cognitive decline and dementia and their caregivers to access information, assistance, and long-term services and supports; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Sections 306 and 712(a) of the Baltimore County Charter and Section 10-6-102 of the Baltimore County Code, 2015, as amended, the County

Council may accept gifts and grants, appropriate same to the Gifts and Grants Special Revenue Fund and expend the same, said fund having been established solely for the purpose of accounting for certain monetary gifts and grants made available to the County for restricted purposes; and

WHEREAS, such fund remains open perpetually as a mechanism to account for the respective gift and grant appropriations and expenditures throughout the entire term of the grant period, including beyond the current expense budget fiscal year; now therefore

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE

COUNTY, MARYLAND, pursuant to the power and authority conferred upon it by Sections 306

and 712(a) of the Baltimore County Charter and Section 10-6-102 of the Baltimore County

Code, 2015, as amended, that the Current Expense Budget for the fiscal year ending June 30,

2026, be and is hereby amended by appropriating state funds made available to the Baltimore

County Department of Aging, in the amount herein specified, to the following program:

GR-2134 Long-Term & Dementia Care Program \$179,916

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having been passed by

the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect December 28,

2025.
