FOR the purpose of establishing an exception to the requirement that all streets in the Honeygo Area have sidewalks such that sidewalks are not required to connect a single-family development to a public road if a pre-existing hiker-biker pathway connects such a development to a public road; and generally relating to uses in the Honeygo Overlay District.

1	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
2	COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations read as follows:

9	§ 259.9. Development standards for H and H1 Overlay Districts.
10	These standards are intended to be additions to, modifications of and exceptions from the
11	standards required by the underlying zoning classification on the land in the area. All conflicts
12	are to be resolved in accordance with Subsection G of this section.
13	F. Parking Standards.
14	5. All streets shall have sidewalks and shall be planted with trees
15	according to the standards for the street classification, as defined by the Honeygo Overlay
16	District Design Guidelines EXCEPT THAT SIDEWALKS ARE NOT REQUIRED TO
17	CONNECT A SINGLE-FAMILY DEVELOPMENT WITH A PUBLIC ROAD IF A HIKER-
18	BIKER PATHWAY HAS ALREADY BEEN BUILT CONNECTING THAT DEVELOPMENT
19	TO A PUBLIC ROAD.

21	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having been passed by
22	the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect 14 days after its
23	enactment.
